WHAT'S NEW

Last evening, I asked Linda, "What does the congregation want to hear from their pastor?" Her response was, "What is going on in the CSS?" I purposely stay away from that subject in my daily devotions and devote them to scripture, my feelings, and activity.

But before I get into the CSS activity, let me finish (probably never will be finished) my difficulty in getting past the funeral I conducted last Tuesday. It came to me this morning when I got up: I had a picture in my mind of Leland's wife, his son and wife, and daughter and wife, standing at his casket, looking at Leland and all the grandkids stuff that went with him to his grave. It finally hit me ... it was a picture of my own family. The ages are almost identical. I've known Leland's family since the now grown son and daughter were nine and seven. I think I can now come to grips with it all. May God take care of them all.

Let me shift gears and let you know what is taking place in the CSS. The first zoom I was on yesterday was the CSS Walking Together gathering. It is a once a month gathering that Bishop Candeia holds for all the clergy in the CSS. It's usually just a check-in, and then some small group discussion. Yesterday the subject was where are your congregations on this Lenten journey all the way through Easter.

Two pastors talked about what their congregations are doing, both were close to what we are doing, but with a couple of things different. One of the congregations is from Kansas, the other from the St. Louis area. First, the things that are the same:

- In person worship
- Live streaming
- Masks & social distancing
- Communion, one church like we use to do, the other church bread from the presider and take your own pre-filled cup (kind of like we use to do)
- One preacher preaches with mask off and wanders, the other with mask on and in pulpit/lectern
- As near as I could tell the music/singing was much like we do

Now what was different:

- One church takes by appointment only for in person worship (they max out at 50)
- One church has information on a screen for both in person and live streaming
- One church is doing Wednesday Lenten fellowship by ordering from a local restaurant which delivers, you are given your meal and then sit in their fellowship area unmasked while they eat, then have a service much like we use to have on Wednesday's during Lent
- One church in the Kansas City area is going to open their worship space on Good Friday but regulate the people that come in on a come, pray and kneel at the cross station that is up against the altar. The idea was that their focus in the past, much like ours, was come to the altar area and do the same, but now we have the social distancing issue

This is what I've heard in the last couple of months and also on Tuesday from other clergy: We still have churches in the rural area that have been wide open for a long time and don't have any restrictions, although some of the parishioners who

attend do wear masks and attempt to social distance. The Lenten journey and Holy Week for them will look like it always has.

At the other end of the spectrum, we have some churches who are still not open at all and who are offering taped worship much the same way we did way back in March of 2020 until we opened at the end of June.

As you probably remember, because I'm just a young whippersnapper, after I was ordained, I was assigned a Coach (in my case, former Bishop Roger Gustafson), and I was assigned to a First Call Team that Bishop's Associate Dave Whetter leads.

In addition to these, I was assigned to the Congregational Vitality ELCA group and attend a long series of zoom discussions.

Almost all of the subjects discussed have moved on from the pandemic and the First Call issues that come up from folks that went through the normal process. Now, the subjects are a result of last summers protesting, and focus on racial injustice. As an example, our First Call Team is about to start discussion on a book entitled "The Black Christ" by Kelly Brown Douglas.

And now, I'd like you to take this famous scripture from 1 Corinthians 13:4-8a: "4Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant 5or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. 7It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 8Love never ends."

This is of course, Paul's letter to the folks in Corinth and Paul is talking about God's Love. By the way, that is not romantic love that Paul is talking about, it is God's Love. Lest we forget it: God is Love.

Remember in John 15:12, Jesus says this, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have love you."

So now ask, "Is Pastor Larry patient?" I get a "C" at best. It's something to ponder ourselves. Put yourself in that text and see how you do. What grade would you give yourself?

God is good and full of GRACE! Thank Goodness.

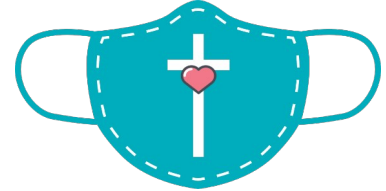

Arts As Healing

Arts As Healing Foundation (AAHF) “Creative Outreach Program”, funded in part by the Arts and Education Council, is expanding in 2021 and we are inviting you to join us!

AAHF program addresses the problem of stress, loneliness, depression, and emotional isolation by introducing the magic of art and creative expression. Arts As Healing was founded on the principle that the creative arts aid in the healing process for those who have experienced or are experiencing a physical or emotional challenge. And is especially needed during the ongoing pandemic. Our program gives people a positive focus at the same time it provides a new awareness of untapped creative talents and skills. We have seen, and our participants have told us, that their lives have changed through their ability to express themselves visually, learn a new skill, and to be productive in a new way.

Once enrolled, an AAHF instructor will call and introduce themselves, and explain the benefits of the program. The AAHF instructor will also inquire about your art experience, goals for enrolling, and expectations from the program.

For many this may be the first time taking an art lessons. Be assured that you are never judged; this is an opportunity for creative expression and exploration. The classes cover a variety of media and techniques. Projects will build as basic skills are mastered. Each unit will last approximately 4 to 6 weeks. If current pandemic restrictions persist, classes will be held virtually, via Zoom conferencing.

- **Confirm approval of meeting minutes from Jan 2021 meeting**
 - Motion made, seconded, and approved
- **Pastor's Report**
 - In the Ferguson Ministerial Alliance meeting racism was discussed and how that impacts everyone differently
 - Plan on having an Outdoor Easter Sunrise Service at 6:30am on April 4th
 - Ella Jones brought up Ferguson Council meetings and extended an invitation to attend them
 - Pastor's Annual Report and Congregational Annual Report have been submitted
 - Organist Changes
 - Dr. William Sullivan has resigned effective February 21st and Carolyn Rock will be returning as organist
- **Space Sharing Update**
 - Boone from Woke Bridge Community Church has indicated that they will be sending the \$500 deposit (as requested after January's Council meeting)
 - He would like to show the office space to some team members
 - An attorney drafted a non-binding letter of intent (for no charge) to be signed to go along with the deposit. This is not the formal lease agreement that will be signed once final terms are negotiated and the congregation approves. The letter of intent lays out the charges that the Council proposed in January.
 - Pastor is going to give the letter of intent to Boone to discuss and sign
 - The first priority will be to clear out the office area
 - Bill has moved electronics out of the office
 - Janet, Pam, Kristen, and Justin have volunteered to go through the CDC paperwork to save or discard securely

- Current plans are to keep the room closest to the main stairs for Zion's storage (Room 1)
- **Team Reports**

 - Lenten Devotionals will be sent out by mail
 - Every Wednesday after Ash Wednesday, will be a Zoom meeting to use the devotionals
 - Will put a container of disposal Communion packets in the coat room for people to come pick up for streaming the service
 - Going to start doing Children's Messages for kids who are virtually streaming the service
 - Still focusing on maintaining social distance during service
 - Discussed having a Lector again that will come into the altar area from the office and leave via the office when the readings are complete
 - Valentines Afternoon Zoom Gathering
 - 3:30pm zoom session
 - Fun games and discussions
 - Will last about an hour
 - Member Care Ministry – Doris
 - Did not meet in February
 - Discussions about older members and their needs of prayers
 - Having a meeting in March
 - Property – Pam/Johnnie
 - No updates
 - Treasurer Report – Bill
 - Church is in the red for \$357 for the month of January and the CDC is in the red for \$168 due to expenses being coded to the CDC in error. These will be corrected in February.
