

Reforming Spirit — Liberate Us!

As a choir "geek," I can't count the number of times I've auditioned with the words of *America*. "Sweet land of liberty, of thee I sing." From time to time in church, we hear about God's "liberating" love through the death and resurrection of Jesus. And this month, as we gather to commemorate Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation, we will encounter the "freedom of a Christian."

Liberty, Freedom, Liberation. It's awfully hard not to see these words and think of the grand American experiment of which we are a part. Liberty evokes bells and the cries of the founding mothers and fathers; Freedom connects with the First Amendment and has served as the impetus for so much of our military history; it's almost as if these words jump off the page with red, white, and blue stars and fireworks.

Yet even more, these words—Liberty, Freedom, Liberation—have a <u>deeper history in the life of Christ-followers throughout the millennia of the Church.</u> Long before any Bills of Rights, the apostle Paul spoke of the Holy Spirit—setting humans free from captivity to sin, death, and the law. Nearly 250 years before the American Revolution against England, Martin Luther wrote on Christian "Liberty," whereby we are perfectly free—subject to no one, and simultaneously wholly bound—connected to the needs and care of our neighbor. Freed to be of loving service to another. As it says in Galatians: "For freedom, Christ has set us free!"

And the freedom we have in Christ is not just personal, but is a collective liberty and liberation we share! This month, we will begin a series of conversations about Zion's future. It is my hope that a spirit of liberty, freedom, and liberation from God through Christ will surround us as we look ahead to what might be most faithful for our congregation's next steps.

There is a bold, reformation-based truth I want us all to hear as we begin these conversations. We are doing hard work in having honest and truthful conversations about our congregation's future. We will trust the Spirit of God is leading us and surrounding us in the places where these conversations are hard and painful. But most of all, NONE OF OUR SALVATION IS AT STAKE by engaging in this faith-full work. We are truly freed and liberated—a congregation with the freedom to imagine boldly, freedom to make mistakes, freedom to disagree, and the freedom of Christians—to look to the needs of our neighbors as we begin to decide what our congregation's future will be. The Spirit of life is among you. The Spirit of God's liberty is the freedom of which our hymns sing: Freedom isn't just coming, it's already ours through Christ Jesus. Amen.

OPENING QUESTION AND PRAYER

- If Zion were to wake up tomorrow and there was a miracle that made your fears/concerns/thoughts about Zion's future vanish into thin air, what would the miracle be? Why? People and money are not a concern
 - If we had money, there are various things we could do with that, and people would feel more secure
 - We would be doing a lot of the things we are doing now, but you wouldn't be asking the same people to do those things and would be able to enhance what we are doing
 - Energizing and no possibility of burn out and could be open to do something entirely new - could do something with the building we have or think about joining with other congregations to open a community building - a hub
 - Will have explored all the ways that other churches in our position have done to move forward
